





Bloomington Public Schools is proposing a renewal on the ballot this fall to...

- Reinvest in School Safety and Security
- Reinvest in Next Technologies for Learning

In 2013, voters approved a 10-year capital projects levy which provided funding for school safety/security and educational technology. That referendum is set to expire in 2024.



School Safety and Security

- Enhance security measures including a visitor management system
- Upgrading alarm, video and emergency communications
- Expand training in threat assessment, incident response and mental health



Next Technologies for Learning

- Expand anytime/anywhere learning solutions
- Improve classroom technology and digital learning platforms
- Empower teachers with technology integration skills and tools
