
### **Artful Learning**

### Kindergarten Artful Learning Unit #1

#### **Relationships - Charles Schulz**

- How do my actions affect and create relationships?
- Students will learn that their actions affect and create relationships with people and things around them and the relationships they make will have a lasting impact on their lives.
- Our masterwork is Charles Schulz's Peanuts Gang. We have fun comparing our staff to the characters of the Peanuts Gang.







### Kindergarten Artful Learning Unit #2

#### **Diversity - Snowflake Bentley**

- How do our uniquenesses create the diversity around us?
- Students will examine snowflakes the way Wilson "Snowflake" Bentley observed and photographed them in nature.
- Students love taking snowflake pictures using a Proscope microscope camera to see the intricate designs.

- Where are there patterns in my world and why are they important?
- Students have fun learning about about Frank Lloyd Wright's Robie House in Chicago.

# Ready for kindergarten!





### Kinder-ready Checklist

Families and caregivers can help children get ready for kindergarten by helping them practice these skills and milestones:

#### **Independent Skills**

- Practice using bathroom independently with door closed
- Practice zippers, tying shoes, buttons

#### **Academic Skills**

- Understand letters, sounds and numbers
- □ Count to 10
- Recognize colors
- Recognize basic shapes
- Positive about school and kindergarten
- Practice writing letters and numbers
- Practice writing name
- Practice using a scissors
- Read with your child for at least 15 minutes daily





### Kindergarteners learn...

#### Literacy and Reading

- How to recognize letters and sounds and write letters for letter sounds
- How to recognize and produce rhyming words
- How to identify the beginning, middle and ending sounds of words
- 45 frequently used words
- How to draw, write and narrate a story
- How to spell words phonetically
- How to ask and answer questions about a reading

#### Math

- Read, write and show numbers
- How to create, complete and extend patterns
- How to count forwards and backwards
- How to find one more or one less than a number
- Basic Addition and Subtraction

#### Health

- How to identify healthy behaviors
- Listening skills





### Kindergarteners learn...

#### **Social Studies**

- How to demonstrate civic skills in a classroom
- Identify examples of rules in the school community and explain why they exist
- Distinguish between individual needs and wants
- Compare and contrast traditions in a family with those of other families

#### Science

- Weather and the sun study of the seasons
- Push/Pull objects in motion
- Plants and Animals Observe and compare plant and animal habitats

#### Life Skills

- How to use time effectively
- How to follow directions
- How to show respect to self, staff and peers
- How to work cooperatively with others
- How to work independently

### Kids' SAFARI - Before and After School Care

Before (6:30 - 9:20 a.m ) & After (3:50 - 6:00 p.m.) School Care

**Kids' SAFARI** is our before-and after-school care program for children in kindergarten through grade 5, offering enrichment opportunities and creative learning experiences designed to increase social interaction and lead children to discover friendship, independence and confidence.

Kids' SAFARI is fee-based and available at all Bloomington Elementary schools. Kids' SAFARI accepts all students residing in or attending an Elementary school in Bloomington.

### Safety, Childcare & Transportation

#### Safety and Security

The safety and well-being of your child is our top priority. Our schools all have secure, monitored, single-point entry during the school day. Students are not allowed to leave during the school day unless signed out by an authorized adult. All visitors must sign in at the school's main office and wear a visitor badge.

#### **Busing & Transportation**

We provide transportation to resident elementary students (K-5) who live in the school's attendance area and live at least half a mile from school.

Students living in the walk area – less than half a mile for elementary – may be eligible for busing through our pay-to-ride program.

### Kindergarten Registration - Health

#### **Health Records**

- Send copies of immunization records
  - State law requires: 5 DPT, 4 Polio, 2 MMR, 3 Hepatitis B and 2 Varicella shots or the date of chickenpox disease.
- Provide a copy of child's birth certificate
- Forms for student medications, treatment, and health concerns.
- A minimum of one emergency contact and their phone number
- BPS Health Services and Forms

### Kindergarten Immunizations

- Bloomington Public Schools received a grant from Bloomington Public Health this year to provide free school required immunizations to all students.
- Nurses from Homeland Health are here tonight to give any school required immunizations to your child if you are interested. Siblings can get vaccinated too!
- Please stop by the nurse table in the lobby to see if your child needs any of the required vaccinations. We are able to look up vaccination records in the MIIC system (Minnesota Immunization Information Connection).
- o If your child will not be receiving the school required immunizations for health or other reasons, please stop by the nurse table to pick up an exemption form.
- Free immunizations are also available at Bloomington Public Health (952-563-8900) and Pond Health Commons (952-681-6277).
